Child Development & Education

In 2020, total 4568 children have directly benefited from the child rights and quality education related programs and activities implemented by Peacewin in community. To bring out-of-school children to school and increase their learning achievement, municipalities, district education coordination units, school, teachers, parents and children's related activities could not be conducted as in previous years due to Covid 19 pendamic but through virtual, awareness related activities, enrollmentt campaign, education and curriculum related activities were in close coordination and collaburation with Disrict Education Coordination Committee.

In close coordination with District Education Coordination Unit and education unit of local government various educational activities were conducted and also supported physical infrastructure, classroom management, sitting arrengement, sports mateirals in 25 schools and 4 child development centers for making the learning of the schools and child development centers effective. In this year, 1,850 children have received direct educational support for regularity of children at school and education. School were supported and equipted with physical infrastructure and calssroom management for creating effective learning environment in the classroom to ensure the right of children to education through child-friendly, gender-friendly and inclusive education.

Various educational materials have been provided to 15 schools and libraries have been set up in 5 schools for safe and effective learning environment. Trainings, seminars, interactive discussions, audits, public hearings, etc. were also conducted with the participation of teachers, parents, children and other stakeholders. Various campaigns were conducted at project implemented area in coordination with various partners to improve school-community relations, make school education effective, formulate strategic plans and make activate child rights mechanisms. Technical and financial support also provided for the formulation of local level education policy, procedures, school improvement plan, disaster risk mitigation plan. The Education Strategic Plan of Badimalika, Budhiganga and Triveni Municipality were updated with the facilitation of Peacewin. There have been made discussions, interactions on gender-friendly schools and ten rights of education. During the covid 19 pendamic period, childrens' learning were continued through alternative mediums such as radio education and toll education with the support of various partners. Through the

concept of home teacher facilitated to create a learning environment for children in some tolls of Budhinanda Municipality.

Handwashing stations have been constructed in 46 schools and 16 health posts to be safe from covid. In the same way hygiene materials have been also distributed for hygiene of the children which was supportive for continuity of the school after lockdown.

Women and Youth Leadership

Campaign-oriented activities were conducted in tihs year to ensure the participation of women and adolescents for access to justice and health to ensure women's human rights. Campaigns were launched against harmful traditions which hindered the progress of women. Activities were implemented by focusing on women's health in Gandaki Provinence. Trainings, seminars have been conducted in collaboration with the local level for capacity building of women and policy making. 48 percent girls in child club which were formed in 23 schools of Bajura district.

Although it is difficult to conduct campaign related activities due to Kovid, the participation of women in planning process of municipalities has increased. 16-day campaigns against gender-based violence were celebrated by using safty measure of Covid 19. These campaigns conducted by covering various issues of child abuse, child marriage, and sexual violence, equal pay for equal work, domestic violence and abuse. Food items were supported to 393 women to address the direct impact of the covid pendamic. Budhinanda Municipality reviewed and implemented the community scorecard to make the complaints response process effective related to women. 5 women were supported who were seeking legal redress in cases of sexual violence.

The campaign against the practice of chhaupadi has been launched in coordination with the NGOs working in the Kolti Belt. Discussions and interaction with 107

farmers' groups on women's rights, child marriage and women's participation was also completed. Two women cooperatives were supported to develop the institutional development plan which plan is implementing. The two women who were living in the safehouse were given legal advice and lobbied for justice.

Reproductive health and menstrual hygiene management related activities were conducted to build the 40 capacity of school's adloscents girls. 8 Gender friendly toilets were constructed in 8 school. The youth information centers of Triveni, Budhiganga

Changed the Life

Juna Jethara Budhiganga Municipality 5, Bajura says that her son is healthy. There are 5 members in his family. She is past 30 and reached 31 years old. She has got 5 members in her family. She is member of Rishi Dev Krishak Samuha. Her youngest son was malnourished.

She says that they are the poorest family in her village with little food and land. Even when she was pregnant, she could not get nutritious food. Although her son was fine for 6 months, his son became thin after 10 months. The staff of Peacewin came and when saw my child, asked the women's health volunteer to check her son. After checking, finded her son was in malnutrition.



As They finded that the child was malnourished, I was Provided 1 set hazari, 2 quail garden pipe, 3 kg nursery plastic, 1 drum for liquid manure, 2 sprinklers, 1 spare, 1 packet of tomato seed, 2 packet of chilli sheed to construct the Neturition Guardern. I have received regular technical support for oatmeal cooking method, feeding time, and regular check-ups at the health post.

Badimalika municipalities were equipted with material and facilitated to make them technology friendly. In this year, the strategy giving priority to youth was adopted in every campaigns, development and income generating activities from which 64 youths were involved in self-employment.

Livelihood

In 2020, activities such as institutional development of cooperatives, revolving fund and child grant fund mobilization, capacity building of farmers implemented. In the same way capacity development of cooperatives for youth self-employment and different developmental activities were implemented through various projects. In Badimalika, Budhiganga, Triveni and Budhinanda municipalities, supported for

formulation of revolving funds mobilization guideline and also facilitated to local government for providing grant money to youth. Sheeds supported to 3500

Laxmi Cooperative, which is operating a revolving fund and child grant fund in collaboration with Peacewin under Badimalika Municipality. The fund is also investing to youth self-employments who were trained youths. In the same way 5 % of the annual profit of the cooperative is deposited in the account of the child grant fund. From which 96 economically deprived children were supported. The support has helped for regularity of children at school.

households of Himali village Municipality, Budhinanda municipality and facilitated to be the member of cooperative.

Out of the amount provided to youth through cooperatives interest rate 10% per annum, 36 extremely poor children

provided educational supports which have continued their schooling. The cooperatives have continued depositing 5 percent of the annual accumulated profit in the account of the child grant fund for improving the economic and educational condition of poor children. Hatemalo Sana Kisan Bahudeshiya Sahakari Sastha Ltd. Rs. 8,000. Lakshmi Bachat Tatha Rin Sahakari Sastha Ltd. Rs. 12,600, New Vision Sahakari Sastha Ltd. Rs. 11,500 and Kalika Sahakari Sastha Ltd. Rs. 8,800 deposited in the account of the child grant fund and this amount also distributed to childre. Discussions have been held with the local level for mobilization of revolving fund through cooperatives. The local level and the concerned wards have been entrusted for mobilization and regulation of the revolving fund. In Himali Rural Municipality and Budhinanda Municipality, 107 farmer groups have been facilitated for affiliation at the local level. Among them 22 groups were affiliated.

Good Governance, Human Rights & Democracy

PeaceWin worked in the feild of good governance in 2020 with belief that grovernment should be accoutable to the citizen and citizen also obeys their duties and lobby with government as conscious citizen. In order to increase the quality of services and facilities provided by the local government public hearings of wards, rural municipality and municipality, community score table were conducted in Himali Rural Municipality, Budhinanda Municipality. Activities were conducte for advocacy and lobbying with local government and facilitation for formulating plans as well as prioritize local issues. In order to maintain Peacewin's own good governance, all projects were approved by local level assemblies as like last year. Activities such as internal and external audit, tax payment, public review of completed activities, public

hearing, public audit etc. were completed. 11 complaints received through complaint response mechanism were addressed in a timely. 156 hoarding boards were set up focused on good fovernance.

Advocately assisted under the youth participatory development for youth participation in local level planning process. Youth and children were involved in planning process of local government as well as there were the allocations of budget for the development of the children's and youth sector.

The Badimalika Municipality has provided Rs. 250,000 and Triveni Rs. 100,000 for the management of the Renewable Fund of the Youth Information Center. Badimalika municipality updated the education policy with the technical support of Peacewin. In the same way letter of commitment has also taken in the presence of all the cooperatives of municipality to make the entire cooperatives child friendly. In addition, 26 youths have applied for employment through the Youth Information Center among them 5 youths have got employment opportunities at municipality and and other governmental and non-governmental organizations. To develop the capacity of adolescents and adolescent groups have been formed in 16 schools and provided training. In order to manage the business of the youths working in the field of small enterprises, 9 young entrepreneurs in district and 4 young entrepreneurs outside the district awarded in Enterprinure Day. 34 (21 women and 13 men) young entrepreneurs from Budhiganga, Triveni and Badimalika municipalities were supported cash Rs. 15,000 (fifteen thousand) per person whose business shut down closed due to Covid 19. Under the coordination of Badimalika, Triveni and Budhiganga Municipalities and Home and Small Industries Development Committee, 6 youths have received material about Rs. 100,000 for business promotion. Work was done in coordination with District Youth Council to advocate on the issue of youth. In order to develop positive thinking in youth, life skills, financial skills related trainings and capacity building activities were conducted in collaboration with Enterprise Development Branch of Municipality and District Home and Small Industries Development Office of Bajura.

25 young people were directly involved in raising awareness about the Kovid epidemic. 26 youths have received on-the-job training (agriculture and sub-overseers) which made them easier to develop their abilities and geting jobs.

Disaster Resiliances and Response with Physical Safty

In this year, Peacewin has planted 6,500 fruits, 100 bamboo plants and Napier grass in different areas of Budhinanda Municipality and Himali Village in coordination and partnership of respected local government for environment and disaster management. Awareness programs were in different communities and drill exercises have been conducted in 14 schools to protect children from the risk of earthquakes. 58 local skilled jammers have been given 5 days training for construction of earthquake resistant structures. Since the beginning of this year, awareness-raising campaign in the community through volunteers to prevent the Kovid epidemic and prevention related activities were conducted. In the same way facilitated for preparation of disaster prevention plan in coordination with the local government to save lives from the epidemic. Reflections are continuously facilitating in community to plant trees for environment management and conserve forests. For preventing environmental pollution, campaigns such as use of toilets, management of garbage pits, sanitation of house, improvement of cattle sheds, management of cattle ranches were conducted continuously. PeaceWin facilitated for preparation of disaster preparedness plan of Bajura district as well as disaster preparedness plan of four local levels. Relief was distributed to 62 flood-affected families this year and scholarships were provided to continue the education of their children. PeaceWin also prepared Covid Response Plan for own institutional reforms to deal with pandamic and disasters which is implemented.

Physical infrastructure programs were implemented in coordination with government at the local level to ensure the human rights of the citizens, make their daily life comfortable and make the services effective. Construction of 9 irrigation canals, 3 gavin walls, 3 vegetable collection centers, 2 processing centers, 1 child development center building and 8 bridges have were constructed. In the same way 18 new bridge survey designs have been completed.

Nutrition and Hygiene

Sanitation and nutrition related awareness raising activities have been continuously conducted in the community. In collaboration and collaburation with health management committee, health organizations and women's health volunteers, awareness raising programs on nutrition and sanitation were conducted in Badimalika, Budhiganga, Triveni and Budhinanda Municipalities and Gaumul, Khaptad Chhededaha Rural Municipalities. 3550 women, men and children were participated in the home visit and community discussion program in this 2020. 225

women health volunteers have received training on nutrition, sanitation and safe maternity services under the Abortion Ecosystem Empowerment Project at all nine local levels of Bajura district. In the samy way 335 natural leaders, community volunteers and youth club members have facilitated community people on hygiene and nutrition. Through Badimalika, Budhiganga Municipality and Toli Youth Information Centers awareness programs were conducted in the community on how to maintain social distance and distributed the masks, sanitizers to be safe from Kovid-19. Extracurricular activities and interaction program on clean drinking water, nutrition and sanitation have been conducted in 25 secondary schools of the bajura district.

Climate Adaptation and Environment Management

Discussion was made with Disaster Relief Committee under District Administration Office and facilitation for preparaiton of Disaster Preparedness Plan of Bajura and all 9 local levels of the district. In 2020, 6500 fruit saplings, 100 bamboo saplings and Napier grass have been planted in different areas of Budhinanda Municipality and Himali Rural Municipality in coordination and partnership with local government for climate adaptation and environment management. Similarly, drill exercises have been demonstrated in 25 schools of Bajura district every Friday to be safe form the risk and impact of earthquakes and other natural disaster. In the same way community awareness programs have been lunched by the students. 5 days training has been provided to 58 local skilled labors for the construction of earthquake resistant structures in the school. As a result, it seems to be useful for public and private housing to be built in the coming days. Interaction programs have been conducted and made discussion on climate change and environment management in the meetings of women's groups in the community and savings groups in cooperatives. Campaigns such as use of toilets, management of garbage pits, sanitation of backyards, improvement of cattle sheds, proper management of cattle manure and tree planting were being carried out in all the nine local levels of the district to prevent environmental pollution. In addition, relief materials were distributed to 75 flood-affected families and distributed about NRs. 1, 00,00,000 covid response materials to all health department of 9 local level.

Institutional development

Based on the lessons learned from pandamic problem and the use of digital media, the strategic plan of organization has been discussed and reviewed. In addition, an emergency covid response plan has been developed and implemented. All plan and program of PeaceWin were approved by local level government. And partnership Work Plan With LGU were developed and implemented. The quarterly, half-yearly and annual audits of various partners and the suggestions from the monitoring were presented in Board Meeting and addressed as well as implemented in time. Legal procedures such as tax payment, annual audit of the organization were completed in time as required. The process of registration in the social security fund has started and at lease 6 months employee's contribution was started to deposit in SSF from this year. All employees and board members Covid 19 insurance was done. Due to the epidemic, the program operation strategy was modified and activities were conducted with participation of maximum 15 participants and using Covid safety materials. In the same way campaign-oriented and crowded activities were reduced. Assessing the Covid effect, the policy was adopted to conduct the activities by using alternative means to employees in the field. Aalmost all the trainings were conducted through digital medium, 65 employees got the opportunity to participate in various capacity-based trainings in this year. Although proposals have been submitted to various partners for projects, Covid Response Project with UNESCO, the Covid Response Project with Actionaid and MHM Project with Good Neighbors International Nepal have been implemented by making agreement.

Monitoring and Evaluation

Peacewin Central Board Members, PeaceWin Project Advisory Committee Gandaki had been monitoring the progress of the project time to time. Monitoring of projects in Kolti area, Budhiganga and Triveni municipality were also done on behalf of the chairperson and board members. The team of supervisors had also monitored the Projects twice this year. Program managers, Policy Instructor, project coordinators, finance and administration team were also monitoring the projects time to time and suggested for improvements. The project heads were monitoring the project on monthly basis and discussing with the project team about the good aspects and the aspects for improvement, an action plan for improvement has been prepared and implemented. Municipal Project Advisory Committees were also monitoring the project twice. Continuing the internal evaluation of the organization, based on the evaluation of the employees, their efficiency was reviewed and improvement plan had prepared and implemented.

In this year, the district, region and central team of partners (WHH, Save the Children, Actionaid, Good Neighbors International Nepal, TBSU, IPAS, UNESCO and PSI) monitored the projects and economic progress of projects. The action plan was prepared and implemented on the basis of monthly audit of voucher, regular audit of financial transactions, internal and external audit. In this year, there had been some reduction in field level monitoring due to Kovid but monitoring had also been continued through digital.



Success Stories

Daily attendance boards increasing the attendance of children

Toli Secondary School is located in Triveni Municipality ward number 4. The

catchment area of this school is Tribeni Municipality ward number 3, 4 and 5. Due to geographical difficulties, students have to travel 1:30 to 2 hours from home to school. The school attendance rate was 42 to 45 % only due take more time to come to school from home in the same way parents did not send their children to school regularly. The



school also did not make any effort to increase the attendance rate.

According to Mr. Tek Bahadur Shahi, a teacher at Toli Secondary School, the parents did not send their children to school in time and the students do not pay attention to come school in time. The students were playing on the way.

The Youth Empowerment Project started reviewing children's attendance at the school in 2016 to increase student learning achievement. The total number of students enrolled in the school and attending students in class every day is analyzed. The names of the absent children are included in the attendance analysis party. The school takes continuous initiative to find out the reason of why the students are absent for three days and also play the initiative role to make the presence of students in school.

At the end of each month, according to the studnets attendance in the class, the Parents are given green card if the attendance rate is above 80 %, yellow card if the

attendance rate is 60% and the red card if the attendance rate is 79% through studnets. Parents are also become aware on daily attendance analysis party in the school and the attendance information letter given by school being read by parents.

The school attendance review has developed the habit of regular attendance of children in school. Regular school attendance of children has increased the learning achievement rate.

The attendance rate in schools has increased from 83 percent in 2019 to 88 percent in 2020 due to regularity use of attendance analysis and so that regularity of students in class. According to the school principal Bishnu Ojha, they inform the parents about the attendance status of children on the last day of every month. As a result, children's attendance and learning achievement has increased compared to previous years.

Keshav is Happy in his own labor

"I have 90 chickens laying eggs daily. The price of an egg is Rs 750 even if it is sold

at Rs 15. Out of this income, expense is Rs. 250 for grains and saving Rs. 500 on a Day. So monthly saving is Rs. 15,000 (Fifteen thousand). Out of above this saving, expense Rs 5,000 for household expenses on a monthly basis and I have been saving remaining Rs. 10,000 in the bank. In the coming months, I have100 hens



will lay eggs. From which income will be Rs. 1500 per day."

Keshav Nath is a hardworking youth who is second son of Man Nath and mother Dhana Nath, a resident of Ward No. 4, Bajura District. When no measures were taken in the village to send his borthers and sisters to school, He went to Simla India and was carrying a heavy load on a mountain to help his siblings send money home for read and write.

While he was studying in class 9, he was given the responsibility of taking care of his family, he was forced to drop out of school and work as a labor to feed his younger siblings and his family in the morning and evening. He faced many problems for meeting the daily needs of family. So, he was selected for the training on microenterprise of Youth Empowerment Project and he started raising Rs. 30,000's local

breed chickens by taking the loan from cooperative. He earned a good income from his business after working hard. He is one of the young entrepreneurs who repay the loan from the cooperative on time. He donated Rs. 200,000 Loan from the Youth Self-Employment Fund through Laxmi Savings and Loan Cooperative Ltd. to expand his business. With this his investment, Keshav got an opportunity to further improve his business. From this investment, he has 500 of 7 types local chickens.

Youth in access to technology

In order to increase the access of the youth in information and technology, the Youth Information Centers have been established in three municipalities (Badimalika, Tribeni and Budhiganga) of Bajura district from the joint initiation of municipalities and secondary schools and youth empowerment project. The Youth Information




Center has been established to inform youths about information technology and to develop the habit of reading in their spare time. Out of the three information centers, one staff has been arranged in Badimalika Information Center to operate and management of photocopy, computer, internet service, knowledge books, life

skills Books, advertisements and information. After the establishment of the information center, regular meetings of committee members of Information Center are held on monthly basis for management of Infomation Center. The Information Center is lunched the campaign through the scattered youths by getting together which increase their capacity. The Youth Information Center is established and operating with joint venture between Badimalika Municipality and Peacewin Bajura. This information center has played vital role of providing information to all youth through various trainings and providing information of employment published by various governmental and non-governmental bodies and private companies. Through Information of this information center, 9 youths in Badimalika Municipality have used email and internet and 4 youth have got employment opportunities in various government, non-government and private sectors.

The Information Management Committee has 15 members including of dalit and women members. The committee has been formed inclusively with active participation of municipality and ward level youth clubs. Youth information center

also prepared the code of conduct, youth information center operation guideline and child protection policy. While there is no electricity in the market, traders are taking Rs. 10 per photocopy in the market but Youth Information Center serves to all by only taking NRs 5 per Photocopy. Youth Information Center is serving form 7 AM to 7 PM each day. The information center is conducting computer classes on daily and monthly basis. Naw days computer classes have been conducted for 14 youths. Daily 25 to 30 Youth and students are getting free photocopying services, opportunity of reading useful life skills and enlightening books for free. Information center is also keeping daily service record of how many people have taken the service from there. The information center is providing golden opportunity and support to the youths who are away from the service of internet and enlightening books.
